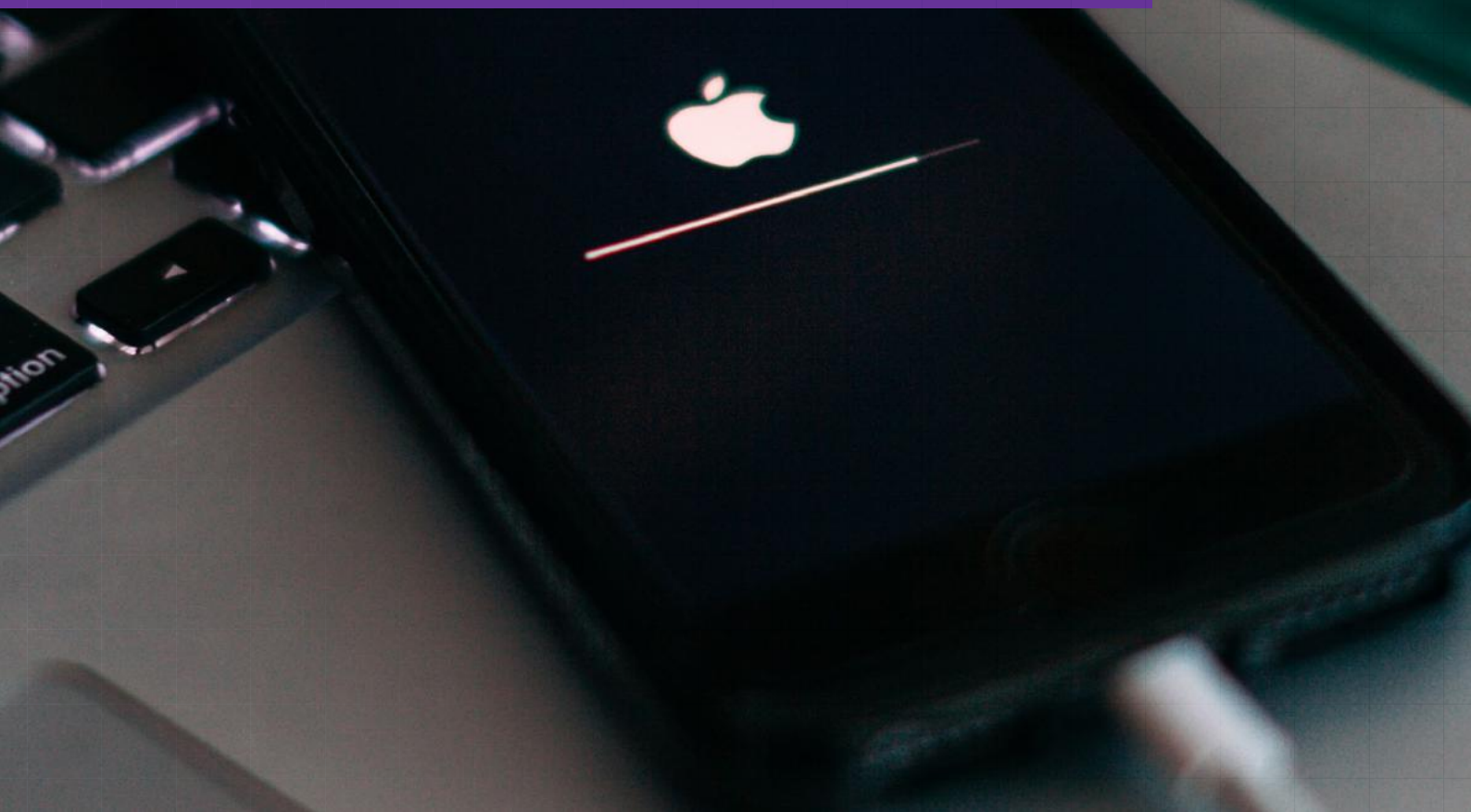


# Updates Are Available

But what about our leadership and the ways we manage people?





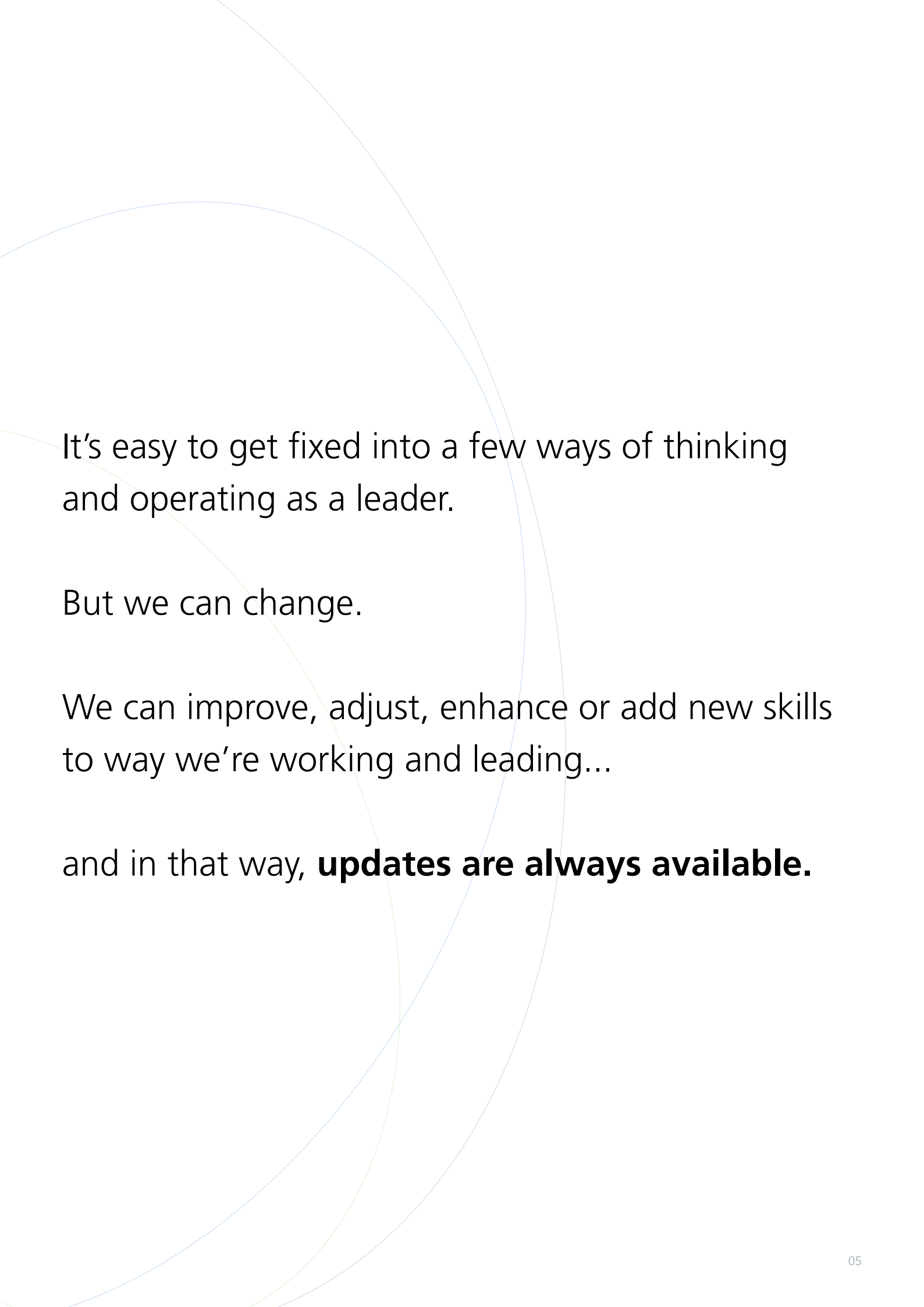
Updates describe improvements.

We can improve, adjust, enhance or add new skills to way we're working and leading...

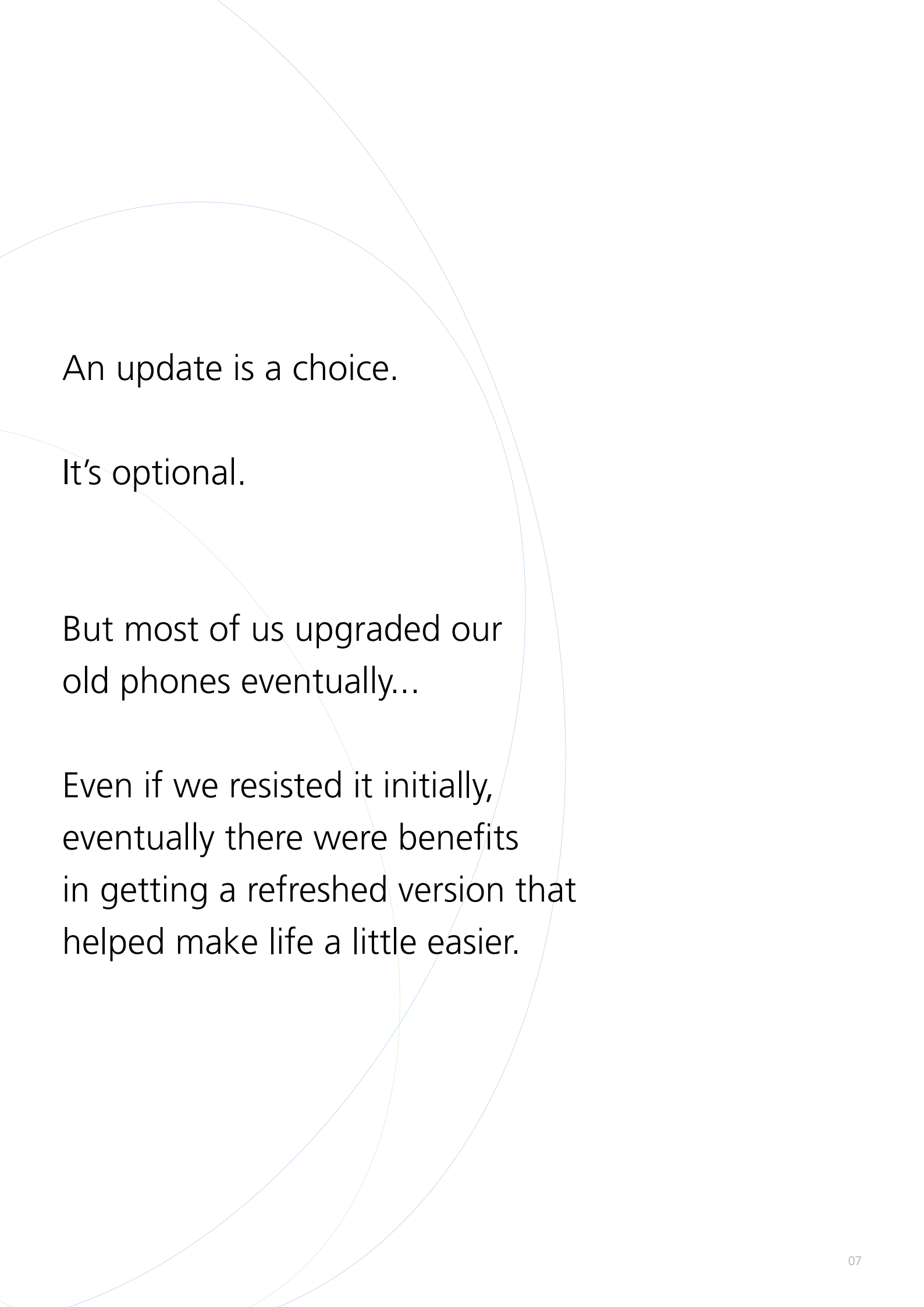
and in that way, **updates are always available.**

Even if we resisted it initially, eventually there were benefits in getting a refreshed version that helped make life a little easier.

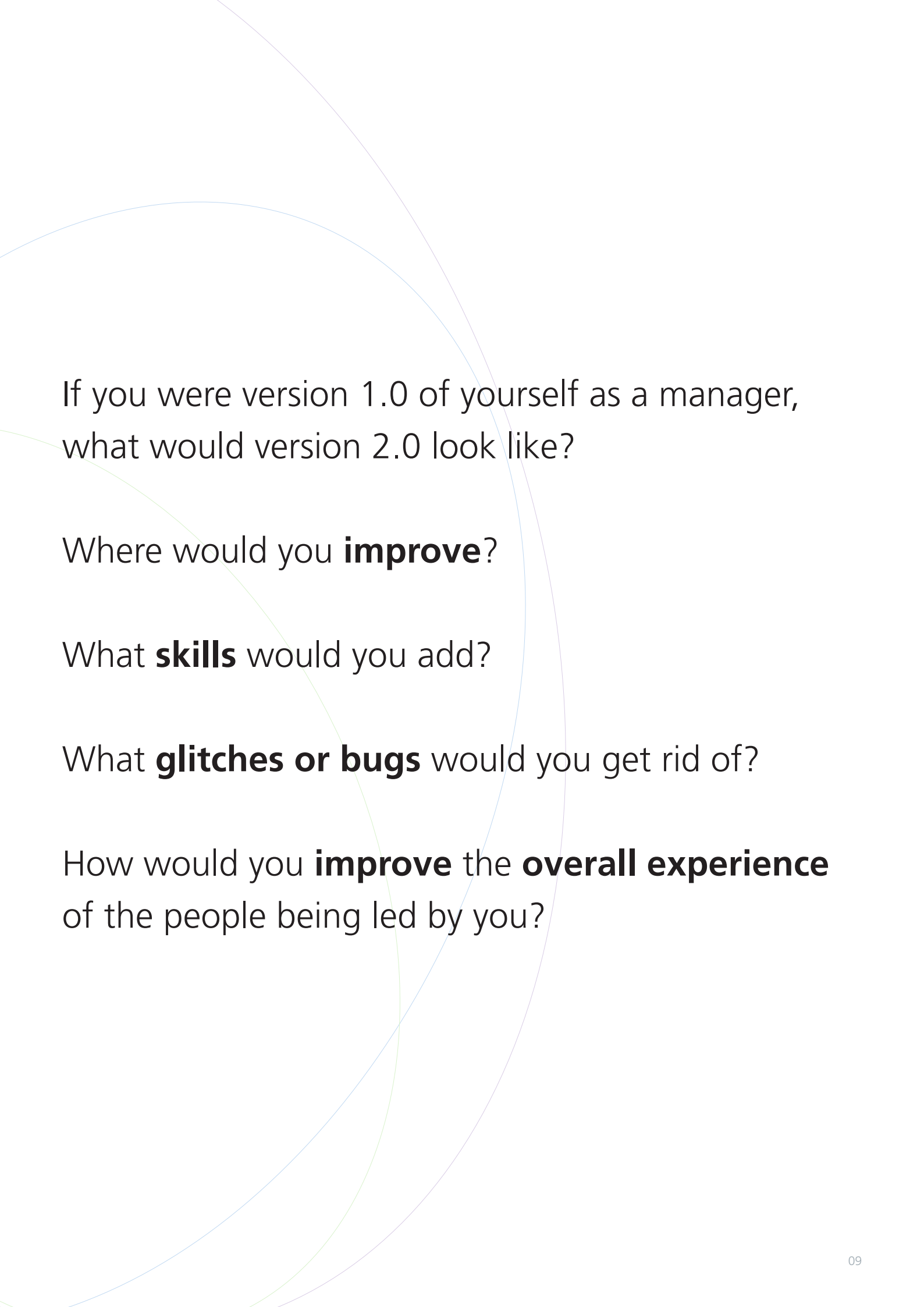




Covid was one big update
